Holiness Made Simple

Dear Church Family,

In recent months I have written to you on the topic of holiness in the life of the church and the individual believer. Now I want to explore the truth that biblical holiness is actually very simple. Living a holy life, as God requires, is not as complicated as one might think.

Let's go back to a key verse on Christian holiness from the prayer of Christ in John 17:17, "Sanctify them through thy truth; thy word is truth." The word "sanctify" means to make holy or separated for God's purpose and glory. This verse makes clear that holiness comes through God's Word. But how does that work? Does it mean that a believer can merely own a Bible and become sanctified? No, not at all. Does it mean that a believer can become holy by reading and knowing the Bible alone? Of course not. This verse means that God will separate and make a believer holy when he obeys and applies the teachings of the Bible.

The Bible is a special book. It is uniquely inspired by God. But it's power is unleashed when we read it, hear it, study it, AND put it into practice daily. Here's how God uses Scripture to make us holy. As God helps us understand what the Bible means and how it applies to our lives, then we believe what Scripture says and follow what it teaches. This results in lives that are increasingly separated from sin and worldly values and changed to reflect godly character and Christ-like attitudes and actions. It's actually very simple. But it's not easy.

Trusting God and obeying His will are never easy because we live in a world that does just the opposite. It's not easy to trust God and obey Him, but by His grace it is possible. And thankfully, it's not complicated, but simple. Living and growing in biblical holiness is simply a matter of trusting God to accomplish His

will through consistent, humble study of Scripture with our hearts devoted to obeying Him. This will involve learning and applying His clear commands and wise principles. It will require prayer and dependence on God's guidance and help. It will include faithful commitment to other believers in corporate worship, Bible study, mutual accountability, and service in the church family. All of these are means that God uses to make us holy. It's a simple plan designed for our eternal good and God's glory.

- religious holiday and a worldwide cultural and commercial phenomenon. For two millennia, people around the world have been observing it with traditions and practices that are both religious and secular in nature. Christians celebrate Christmas Day as the anniversary of the birth of Jesus of Nazareth. Popular customs include exchanging gifts, decorating Christmas trees, attending church, sharing meals with family and friends and, of course, waiting for Santa Claus to arrive.
- **December 25**—Christmas Day—has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1870.
- ◆ Hanukkah (Dec. 18-26): The eight-day Jewish holiday of Hanukkah begins Dec. 18. A central part of the Jewish Festival of Lights entails the lighting of a nine-branched menorah each night. (The ninth candle is used to light the others.) The ritual symbolizes how one day's worth of oil miraculously lasted for eight days during a battle between a small group of Jewish people and the powerful Greek-Syrian army in 165 B.C. Per Jewish tradition, they are said to have emerged victorious and reclaimed the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. Customary foods include latkes (potato pancakes), sufganiyot (jam-filled donuts) and brisket. Children often play with a dreidel (a spinning top with Hebrew letters)


