Pastor's Paragraph May 2025

"Lessons from Doubting Thomas"

One of Christ's special appearances after His resurrection is recorded in John 20:24-29. This appearance was for the personal benefit of the apostle Thomas, who has been remembered through the ages as "doubting Thomas." This negative label overshadows his bold confession when he saw the visible evidence of the risen Lord: "My Lord and my God." Take a moment to read and reflect on the text:

John 20:24-29 ²⁴ But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe. ²⁶ And after eight days again his disciples were within, and Thomas with them: then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace be unto you. ²⁷ Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing. ²⁸ And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God. ²⁹ Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

This passage highlights a few things. First, we see the reluctance of Thomas to believe Christ has risen. The report of Christ's resurrection seemed too good to be true. Thomas insisted on first-hand proof before he would believe. He wasn't gullible, nor was he skeptical; he just needed to be sure. We also see Christ's gracious appearance, eight days later, for the sake of Thomas. With loving concern, Christ invited Thomas to touch the scars in His hands and side, and He urged him to believe. Christ's words and visible evidence of His suffering immediately convinced Thomas and evoked his memorable confession of faith: "My Lord and my God." All of us should be deeply grateful for Christ's reply. Thomas saw and then believed, blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed. Christ was speaking of believers today, you and me.

"Lessons from Doubting Thomas"

Yes, we are blessed indeed because Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures. He was buried, and He rose again the third day according to the scriptures (1 Cor. 15:3-4). Even though we have not seen Christ visibly and personally, like Thomas and the other apostles, we still believe in Christ, and we confess Him as our Lord and God, and therefore we are saved by Him. Our faith in Christ is based on the solid testimony of Scripture. By grace alone we are saved through faith alone in Christ alone. If you, like Thomas, are struggling with any doubts about Christ, take your Bible and read the Gospel of John, and commit your soul to the Lord. Then you will be saved and sure.

Easter celebrations and services are behind us, but the reality of Christ's resurrection and the blessings of our salvation will continue to inspire our daily lives and weekly service and worship. After seeing and believing in the risen Lord, Thomas continued to believe in Him and live for Him, and we have the same privilege. So let's be faithful and fruitful until we see Christ for ourselves in all of His glory.

"Messengers"

Many people have many different messages to share. An investor will share their message of the next great company to invest in. A basketball star will share their next great workout. An architect will share their next great design. But what about the Christian? What is it that we should be sharing? I think we all know the answer to this, and it is the message of the Gospel. We are called by God to share the very same lifesaving message that was shared with us. With this thought in mind, let's be reminded of what Christ tells us in the book of Acts. He says in Acts 1:8 "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." When we study this verse, we can really break it down into two main Parts: 1) The Messenger & 2) The Mission. I want to briefly discuss both of these thoughts.

First, let's consider "The Messenger". We must understand that Christ was speaking to the disciples in the first part of Acts chapter one and in verse four. He commands them to NOT depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the "promise of the Father" which we know, is the Holy Spirit. So, the "Messengers" here are the disciples. Now the word "disciple" in its most basic form means "a follower" and since the underlying principle of Acts 1:8 is evangelism once the Spirit has come upon you, all true followers of Jesus Christ can and should be considered the messengers Christ is speaking to. The amazing thing is that we are no ordinary messengers, we are Spirit Empowered messengers. The Greek word used for "power" in Acts 1:8 is where we get our English word "dynamite' from, and can defined as "force, might, or miraculous power." So, the messengers, who are us, have been given dynamite power through the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit to share the best message of all eternity which is the Gospel!

Next, let's consider "The Mission". In the second part of verse eight, we see the mission field broken up into four sections: Jerusalem, all Judaea, Samaria, and the uttermost part of the earth. If you look at a first century map, these four areas make up the entire known world at that time! So, the mission field is every single person dwelling on the earth we live, and the mission is to evangelize them! Christ said in Acts 1:8 "ye shall be witnesses unto me". This is both a great command and a great promise because Christ is both commanding messengers to share the Gospel, but at the same time He is promising that His messengers WILL be His witnesses!

In closing, I pray that each of us will commit to sharing the Gospel with at least one person a week this month. If we will be faithful to do this, our Sovereign God will bring the increase that He planned in eternity past, our church will be fulfilling its purpose, and maybe, just maybe, God would lead some of the new converts our way so we can minister to and disciple them for years to come.
