

# Pastor's Paragraph November 2025 "A Pastor's Greatest Joy"

I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth. -3 John 1:4

In this text the Apostle John expresses a pastor's greatest joy. It is to know that the "children" or people under his spiritual care are living by the truth that he has taught and preached to them. The pastor's life is filled with many blessings, but none greater or more meaningful that this one. Having been a pastor for 42 years now, I can say a hearty "Amen" to what John wrote about 2,000 years ago. November is the month of Thanksgiving and this is my testimony of thanks to our heavenly Father: "Thank you, Father, for the privilege of serving you and your people. It has been my joy through the years to preach and teach your Word and provide spiritual guidance for your sheep along with the other opportunities to help them in times of suffering and sorrow and to guide the church in fulfilling its important mission."

For the past 27 plus years it has been my honor to serve as pastor (shepherd) of Liberty Baptist Church. This has been a wonderful time for me and my family to be part of our loving fellowship and to worship, pray, learn, grow, and serve together. To God be all the glory for His many blessings along the way!

As you probably know already, I announced my retirement as pastor on Sunday, October 5. I will officially step down on December 31. This decision came after much prayer, soul-searching, and careful thought. It was one of the hardest decisions that I've ever made. After 42 years of pastoral ministry it is not easy to know when to step down, but God has confirmed my decision with a sense of great peace and assurance that it was the right thing to do and now is the right time.

Liberty is already in the process of transition to confirm new leadership by January 1, 2026. As I promised when I announced my decision to retire, my role is not to choose the next pastor, but I am available to counsel and offer guidance as needed. My desire always has been and always will be for God's will and His future blessing upon Liberty Baptist Church.

A Pastoral Transition Team consisting of our deacons was formed early in October and they have made their unanimous recommendation to affirm Rev. Josh Bowman to the office of Pastor-Teacher effective January 1, 2026. Here are the details of the transition process as shared by the Pastoral Transition Team on Sunday, October 2.

- October 26-November 8: Receive questions in writing to the church office, attention Bill Beverly. All deacons will review questions and will respond accordingly.
- November 9-November 23: The Transition Team will start receiving closed ballot votes from active members. For voting purposes an "active member" is defined as a member on our membership role who has attended corporate worship or given to the church at least once in the last few months, or is an individual on the church role who is an active shut-in. All ballots should be submitted in-person to the designated collection box that will be manned by a Transition Team member after every worship service during the voting period. The only exception to this policy is that the Transition Team will hand deliver ballots to active shut-in members who will then mail their ballots to the church office. Ballots will be vetted and counted as they are received.
- <u>December 2</u>: The Transition Team will meet, discuss, and approve the results of the church vote.
- <u>December 7</u>: The results of the vote will be announced during the 10:45 AM service.
- January 1, 2026: If approved, Josh will begin serving the church as Pastor-Teacher.

Obviously, Josh has my full support and deepest appreciation. He has served faithfully as Director of Student Ministry for many years and also as Associate Pastor during this year. I pray that God's will may be done in our church family for His glory alone. Please pray for God's guidance and blessing in this transition time. Thanks again for your love for me and Nancy!

### A Word from Rev. Josh Bowman November 2025

#### "A Foundation for Thankfulness"

#### Thankful Hearts Rooted in Colossians 1

As Thanksgiving arrives, we are invited to reflect not just on material blessings, but on the deeper roots of gratitude exemplified by the Pilgrims. Despite facing immense hardship—battling illness, harsh weather, and the uncertainty of a new land—the Pilgrims gathered in thanksgiving with their Native American neighbors. Their hearts were filled with gratitude not simply for surviving, but for the faith and grace that sustained them through adversity and transformation. This historical moment reminds us that genuine thankfulness springs from recognizing God's hand at work, even when circumstances are far from perfect.

Colossians 1 points us to the ultimate foundation for thankfulness. Paul urges us to "give thanks to the Father," directing our gratitude to the One who bestows both physical and spiritual life. This thankfulness is not reserved for special occasions or future hopes; it is a present reality, a spiritual posture that Paul maintained daily. Our relationship with God is personal and transformative—He is both our Creator and Sustainer, the One who imparts life and lovingly commits Himself to our growth.

Paul further outlines five powerful reasons for our thankfulness: God has qualified us to share in a present and future inheritance among the saints, rescued us from the power of darkness and freed us from sin's grip, transferred us into the kingdom of Christ to live under His loving reign, redeemed us through Jesus' sacrifice—buying us back from slavery to sin—and finally, canceled our debts, reconciling and welcoming us into His family. These blessings are not theoretical; they shape our identity and our daily walk. Our present inheritance is illuminated by the truth and purity of God's word, while our future inheritance is guaranteed by the seal of the Holy Spirit, a promise that cannot be broken.

Real thankfulness, then, is not static; it motivates us toward action. Paul writes, "For this I labor, striving according to His working, which works in me mightily." Our gratitude compels us to serve, love, and witness, empowered not by our own strength but by the power of God at work within us. The Christian life is not meant to be passive. When we truly grasp all that God has done—deliverance, redemption, forgiveness—our hearts overflow in service, even to the point of exhaustion, trusting that God will supply what we lack.

If you have not yet experienced God's deliverance, redemption, or forgiveness, the Gospel remains a living invitation. By repenting of your sins and trusting in Christ, you can receive the inheritance and blessings He freely offers. For those who know the Lord, let this Thanksgiving be more than a holiday. Let it be a time when our hearts are stirred anew with gratitude, and when we resolve to let that thankfulness shape our lives—rooted in God's goodness, evident in our faithful service, and overflowing every day of the year. As we press on through challenges and joys alike, may we never lose sight of our great foundation for thankfulness.
